COMMEMORATE DAY OF REMEMBRANCE 1983:

「思い出の日」：1942年2月19日

十二万の日系人監禁を認可する「立退き命令 9066号」がこの日に署名成立した。

February 19, 1942: Executive Order 9066 is signed, authorizing the incarceration of 120,000 persons of Japanese ancestry.

For many, "Day of Remembrance" is a time to pay tribute to all who were unjustly incarcerated in American-style concentration camps during World War II. In recent years, Day of Remembrance has also become a time for reaffirming the community's determination to seek justice and restitution for that injustice, and prevent similar occurrences in the future.

The Nihonmachi Outreach Committee (NOC), a grassroots community organization active in the movement for redress and reparations and other issues affecting the San Jose Japanese American community, is initiating this year's Day of Remembrance activities (see reverse side of page). So far, the Remembrance program has received the support of the following organizations: the Asian Americans for Community Involvement (AACI), the Asian Law Alliance, the San Jose Buddhist Church Betsuin, and the San Jose Japanese American Citizens League.

We hope that you, your friends, and family will join us to help make this a truly inspiring occasion!
