Dear David,

Enclosed is a copy of the legislation introduced by Senator Matsunaga on Nov. 24 with 52 cosponsors. The only difference between this version, taken from the Commission's report, and the Senate bill is that the Senate bill contains authorization for funding for only the first two years: Sec. 10 (b).

I also enclose a brochure on the Education Fund on the United States Academy of Peace, for which you will note I am counsel. If you know of anyone who wishes to contribute money to this effort, put them on to it, especially before Dec. 31 if they are looking for charitable deductions for 1981. I should note that the brochure is being reworked as we've falling a bit behind in the "schedule of events." Also, the House bill is somewhat different from the Senate one, as an effort to eliminate concurrent jurisdiction between House Foreign Affairs and House Education and Labor; the hope is Foreign Affairs will work on the legislation alone, as Rep. John Ashbrook, the dissenting member of the Commission, lies in wait in Education and Labor.
