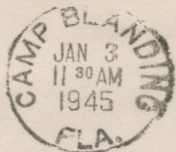

We still don't know when we're shipping out but I'm in no hurry. We still are not supposed to write letters so I'm slipping

my mail in another Post Office.
The weather out here is pretty
good. We've been having nice
weather for quite a while now.

I don't know when I'll be
home but I imagine it's going
to be around the middle of
January, so you can look forward
to something.
