Hi Mom,

I'm just feeling fine today. I guess Jo-Chan is on his way to California. I guess he reached there by now.

I heard that all our mail will be brought in tomorrow so I hope I'll get a lot of letters from you.

We didn't do very much today. We saw training films and this afternoon we had some outdoor practice.

It doesn't snow any more but it's pretty cold. The snow froze and every morning, every thing is slick with ice.

~~That~~ Candy you sent is very good. My friends and I are eating them now.

I bought a wool knit hood a week ago. It keeps my head nice and warm. It covers my whole head and just leaves my eyes, nose and mouth out. It's O.D. colored.

Our barracks buys several cases of cohes every day so we can

drink colas any time we want. I
guess the only thing we lack in reading
material. We can't go to the PX. yet
so we can't get magazines. Our small
PX. (at our ~~own~~ own area) has them
once in awhile. I got some while I was
at the hospital. Boy, I wish I was
back there. It really was nice.

I'm filling in the diary so it should
be interesting to read after the war.

8:30 PM

I'm just loafing around in the barracks.
I'm playing gin rummy with Chester. We're
breaking out a foul even.

I looked out of the window and
it's starting to snow again. I thought
it was too warm today.

Well, that's all for tonight.
I'll write again tomorrow.
