How's things going? I hope Po-chan is
O.K. in San Francisco.

We didn't do much this morning. We
had exercises and stuff.

This afternoon the whole company
went to the movies. We saw Abbott
and Costello in "Here Comes The Co-ed".
It was a funny picture.

We didn't have mail call yet so
I don't know whether I got any letters
or not.

It snowed last night but it was
nice today. It wasn't very cold and the
snow made everything look nice and white.

I hope you enjoyed reading Ted's
letter I sent. I'll have to write to him.

Right now I'm just loafing around
in the barracks.

Our food here is pretty good but the
mess halls were way better at Blanding
and Meade. Today we had ham, corn,
creamed celery, rice, cake and coffee for dinner.
We always have something to eat
that's good so you don't

have to worry about my food situation.
The only gripe I have is that we can't
go to the regular PX to buy magazines
and candy.

Got three of your letters awhile ago.
They were 13's, 14's and 15's letters.

You mentioned about sending money
by wire. By this time, I guess you sent
the money to me. I'll probably get it tomorrow
or so. I didn't think we'd be here
this long and my money is getting kind
of low so I thought I'd better wire
home.

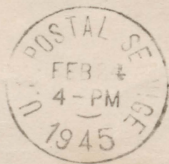
I'm not doing very much right now.
