Well, here I am in New York again. I'm alone this time. You see, it's like this. There's going to be a dance for our company tonight with Nazi girls from New York. So - there isn't going to be any passes today. How did I get a pass? Well, by luck, the captain of our company asked me if I would do him a favor. He said he wanted a note and a package delivered to a friend in New York and would I bring it. I said I'd only be too glad to, and he gave me a pass to New York till tomorrow at 3:00 AM. Out of three companies, I'm the only one with a pass. Pretty nice, eh?

Since it's still early, I'm going to a lunch right after this and then I'm going to a show. I'm planning to go see John Swatum and some friends I met tonight.

I guess you know why I don't put the return address on. I'm not supposed to write from New York unless it's censored.

The weather is pretty nice today so
I didn't have to put heavy clothing on.
I still brought my coat, though, for the night.

Well, I'm off so I'll write
again tomorrow
