Dear Mom and Pop,

Boy, I hit the jack pot today. I got seven letters from you today. It finally caught up. They were March 4-10's letters. I got the stamps too.

I'm going to see if I can locate John tonight. He should be around.

I learned Bob was here but left the day I arrived. I'll see him yet.

We aren't doing anything now. We just loafed around all day today. The weather is really nice around here.

I went to the PX last night and bought some stuff. We can go only once a week and we have to have a ration card. There's a limit on everything.

I think your letters will be catching up with me so until then I won't be able to answer your questions.

I think it's OK to say that we're in the southern part of France. Where we are, we're right in the middle of nowhere. The camp itself is OK but it sure is dusty.

I hope those socks you sent got me. I'm looking forward to that package.

We might get a chance to see some towns
around here so when we do go out I'll
see if I can get you some thing. Of course,
I've been in the war for a long time
so there isn't too much to buy.

We don't do anything so there isn't
much to write about.

I'll write again tomorrow
