SOME CANDY.



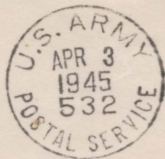
That's O.K., isn't it?

This is about all for now so I'll write again tomorrow.

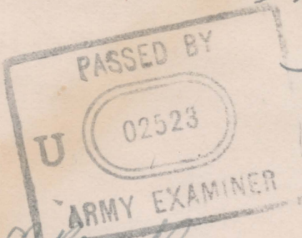
