Dear Mom and Pop,

I didn't write to you yesterday because there was so little to write about. All I did was loaf around and did a little washing.

Our tent pulled guard again today as I'm on guard tonight and tomorrow morning.

The Nisei regiment took the front page in our newspaper today. Maybe it's in the Salt Lake Tribune too. We get a GI paper daily and today it had an article about the 44nd. I thought you'd be interested in it so I'm sending it to you. Save it. It'll be interesting to look at it after the war. It has a picture of some Niseis on the front page too.

The price is supposed to be two lines (2¢) but we get it free.

We went to the movies last nite and saw a cowboy film.

Since we had guard today, we didn't have to go out to drill today so I took a

seen father. I brought a blanket and some
books to read.

Mom, I'm sending some Italian money
home cause I thought you might like to see it.
It's all paper. One is 50 lire (50¢). It was
issued in Italy before the war. The other two are
American invasion currency. One is one hundred
lire or \$1, and the other is ten lire or 10¢.

I'll try to send some French francs
if I could get a hold of some.

Well, this is about all today no
more tomorrow.

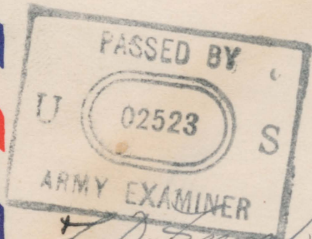
