How's every thing back home? Our mail hasn't come in yet so I haven't the slightest idea what's happening back home.

Our measles restriction is being lifted today so we'll have a chance to look around some of these small Italian towns around here. I hope I can go to Florence one of these days.

We've been on regular training program these past week so they keep us pretty busy. It's not as hard or strict as basic training so I don't mind too much.

I hope you've been getting my mail. Have you heard from Bob or John yet?

April 20, 1945

I'm sorry I didn't finish this letter last night. You see, I met John last night. He was in the hospital in France and he just came over here. I was walking up the street and he called me. Boy, was I surprised.

We talked almost all afternoon and night.

He's already assigned to his unit so I
don't think he's going with us. Maybe
I'll ^{be} with them when I'm assigned.

He looks fine and his foot is all
well again.

I guess this is a fact all for
today.

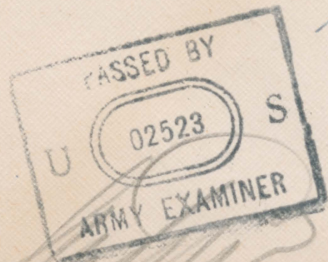
