May 18, 1945

Dear Mom and Pop,

I didn't do much today. We played this morning (the band). We play every morning to wake the boys up. Later on we had practice and after that we just loafed.

I just came back from the creek. I took a bath and washed some clothes.

I received 5 letters (my mistake - 7 letters) yesterday. All were Marches except one which was May 5. I also got one letter from Tom (V mail) it was May 4. My back letters are catching up.

We have a P.W. (prisoners of war) camp near us and everyday more P.W.'s come in. Some even come in Jerry cars. I think there's around 80,000 here but they're going to be segregated.

I told you yesterday where we are. I was wrong. We're around 50 miles from Como and Milan is to our left.

I haven't anything to ask for now but I'm sending a request so you can send me what you want.

I REQUEST You To SEND ME SOME SOCKS AND CANDY.

This is about all for today so save tomorrow
