Well, you see, it's like this; the day before yesterday I was going to write a letter at night but we went to Milton to see a USO show. I had Frank Sinatra, Phil Silvers and Evelyn McKenzie. It sure was a good program. I guess you've heard that Sinatra came overseas for the USO tour. I guess all the kids back home would ^{love} like to see him.

Yesterday we went (Art + I) to Milton again on a pass. We looked all around and then went to the carnival. After that we went to see the 206th band. We had a long talk with our gang (they wanted to know what's happening at Secco) and then came home.

It rained quite a bit this morning but we're having nice weather from the afternoon on.

I think the band will be back around the 18th of next month.
