Now it is Fourth of July. We have a parade this morning and the flyers (20 men) play "To the Colors". The Italians were impressed very much by our regiment.

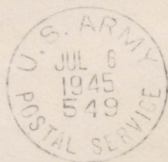
In the afternoon John, Chester and I rented a row boat and we went swimming on the other side of the lake. It's nice and sandy there and the water is warm.
