Dear Mom and Pop,

I'm sorry I didn't write to you but I sure am busy these days. You see, I'm the official prisoner guard for our company. I go to the prison camp every morning and draw out around 60 German prisoners I bring them back and give them to the different sections in our company. I have 12 men working for me too. I have a mess hall to built. All I do is watch them work. I also play for retreat at night. You know, the flag ceremony.

The food here is pretty good. We have fresh vegetables and fruits. Last night we had cantaloupe with ice cream. Tonight we had fresh bananas from the Canary Islands. We get tomatoes, melons, eggs, and other vegetables

fresh. The captain told me the fund
was supposed to come back on the 18th
but it was postponed until the end of this
month. Well, my work isn't hard so
I don't mind.

I'm writing a request for something
again.

I REQUEST you to SEND ME SOME
MAGAZINES.

I hope Aunt Jenni is getting along o.k.
in Salt Lake.
