I got two letters from you today. In the July 28's letter you said to treat the prisoners nice. Well, Mom, I don't go around picking the prisoners around but I don't exactly love them. I don't know how you feel, but I can't

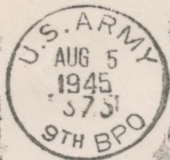
forget that a couple of months ago, these
