I also got the music and the note book you sent me. Thanks very much.

I today's junk (GI magazine) and the Stars and Stripes (GI newspaper), it had a lot about the 442. The magazine had letters written by soldiers from all of European Theater saying of the unfair treatment of *Nisei* back home. The Stars and Stripes had a front page write up about a Soldier (*Nisei*) who was refused in the Veterans of Foreign War.

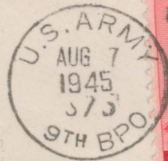
I'm happy to say that the whole 5<sup>th</sup>

General Clark, two other generals, Colonel  
Miller (our commanding officer) to the American

right when we get home or else!
