Dear Mom and Pop,

Well, here I am at school. I'm at a cavalry outfit. There's about 150 men here. So for we (3) are the only students here. We're here as Veterinary Technicians. We'll be here for eight weeks so for the next seven weeks write here. By the eighth eighth week we'll be back with the regiment.

I'm about 110 miles south of Baghdad about 6 miles from a small town called Grossetta.

I'm going to learn everything about horses, so I'm told. Classes start on Monday. I'm even going to learn how to ride a horse.

We're the only Nesis here so they all treat us swell. Even the colonel in charge. They all know about

442nd. Life here is going to be o.k.<sup>2</sup>  
We're sleeping regular findlings and  
we can go to town every night.

The class schedule for tomorrow  
is 9:00 AM to 10:30 AM learning how  
to saddle a horse. 10:30 AM to noon  
how to site and test a horse.

In the afternoon biology and  
anatomy of quadrupeds.

Well, this is a fant all so  
more tomorrow —
