Dear Mom and Pop,

I just came back from horse
back riding. I took a shower and
here I am writing to you. We didn't
have any lectures this afternoon so
we went riding. It's a lot of fun.

I guess you've heard that the war
is ended. Everybody is celebrating over
here but we don't have any holiday.
I guess you'll be home quicker than
expected.

This morning I went to the hospital
and helped out there.

There ~~are~~ are lots of Jerry
prisoners here and they do all
the work needed to be done. They
clean the stables, and such

things as that.

Today about 75 men from the 442 came down to guard the prisoners. Before them, the Italians were guarding. I haven't seen anyone I know yet.

I haven't too much more to write about so I guess I'll call it end for today.

I'll write more tomorrow
