I'm putting the stamps in for you

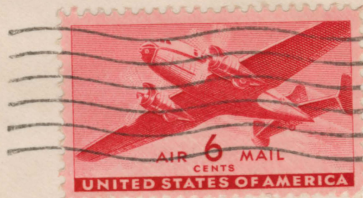
Well, Louis things going at home?
