We didn't have classes in the afternoon because the captain went to Pisa for a few days.

The weather changed all of a sudden these past few days. It's getting chilly in the mornings and evenings and during the day; it's warm but not hot. I guess autumn is getting along.

I brought the shirt you sent over to a Italian lady here and had the sleeves shortened a little. It was about half an inch or so too long. She did a good job on it. I also had my combat jacket fixed too.

It's funny but I haven't been getting letters lately. I hope I got them soon.

I wrote to Frank Marvota a couple of days ago. I had a letter from him, you know. I also wrote to John. He is still near Leghorn.

I'm sending a request again. Pretty soon you'll have to quit because I'll be getting ready to go home.

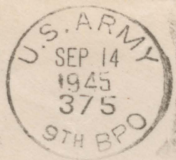
I hope every thing back home is O.K. How is Kenji san and the family getting along? I guess I'd better write to you one of these days.
