The usual things today. Nothing different ever happens out here. I think the camp is moving out to Pisa pretty soon. I don't know as yet when we're moving.

We get our PX again tomorrow. I hope they have some good stuff this time. Every time we get cigarettes I sell them. We can get \$2.50 a pack or \$25 a carton. What the Italians don't know is we only pay 50¢ a carton for them. Heck, every body here sells cigs when they run out of money.

It looks like the high score men are going home pretty quick. I only have 30 points so I'll have to wait till the regiment goes home. Of course, I'm lucky because I'm in the 442<sup>nd</sup>. We have a high priority so the 442<sup>nd</sup> goes home as a unit and we'll be home quicker than other outfits.

I'm trying to get some films so I can take some pictures here but I can't seem to find any. I already have the pictures I took in Florence and Pisa. Art got them for me because I was away and he'll hold on to it until I get back to the company.

Mom, can you get me a can of lighter fluid. I got a lighter at the PX last time but I can't get fluid for it. I don't want to use gas cause it'll spoil the wick. The lighter comes in handy because I don't have to use matches for this and that all the time. The can should cost about a dime. Send a couple.
