Today is our PX day. I hope I get something good. Down here at Pisa, we're not doing a thing. We have until the end of this week but school really finished last week so we're just going to take it easy for a week.

I'm going over to my company today and pick up my mail.

Yesterday we went into town (Pisa) and looked around. Coming home we hired a horse and fuggy and rode into camp. Everybody laughed when they saw us coming in a fuggy with a old horse pulling us.

It's still early yet and there isn't too much to write about so I'll finish this letter later on.

We got our PX a little while ago. I bought a sterling silver identification bracelet for \$5.00. It's a nice heavy one. I guess you know what kind I mean. I'm going to Pina tomorrow and have my name and serial number engraved on it! Well, I spent more money than I thought I would, but, oh, well, I still have lots of money.

How's the car situation coming along? Did you find a car yet? I hope you did. Speaking of cars, I was riding around in a motor bike today. You've seen them back home, haven't you. It's a little scooter with a motor on it. It's a lot of fun. I rode all over camp on it. There isn't any gears on it and it'll only go around 20 miles an hour. When it comes to a small hill, it just stops.

I hope you like the pictures I sent to you. I'll try and take some more

pictures if I can get some more film.

We saw a movie last night. It was
"A Bell for Adano". We saw the beginning of it
in Grosseto but the machine broke down so
we saw the whole thing here.

I was going to my company to pick up
mail today but it looks like rain so I'll
go tomorrow.

maybe tomorrow.
