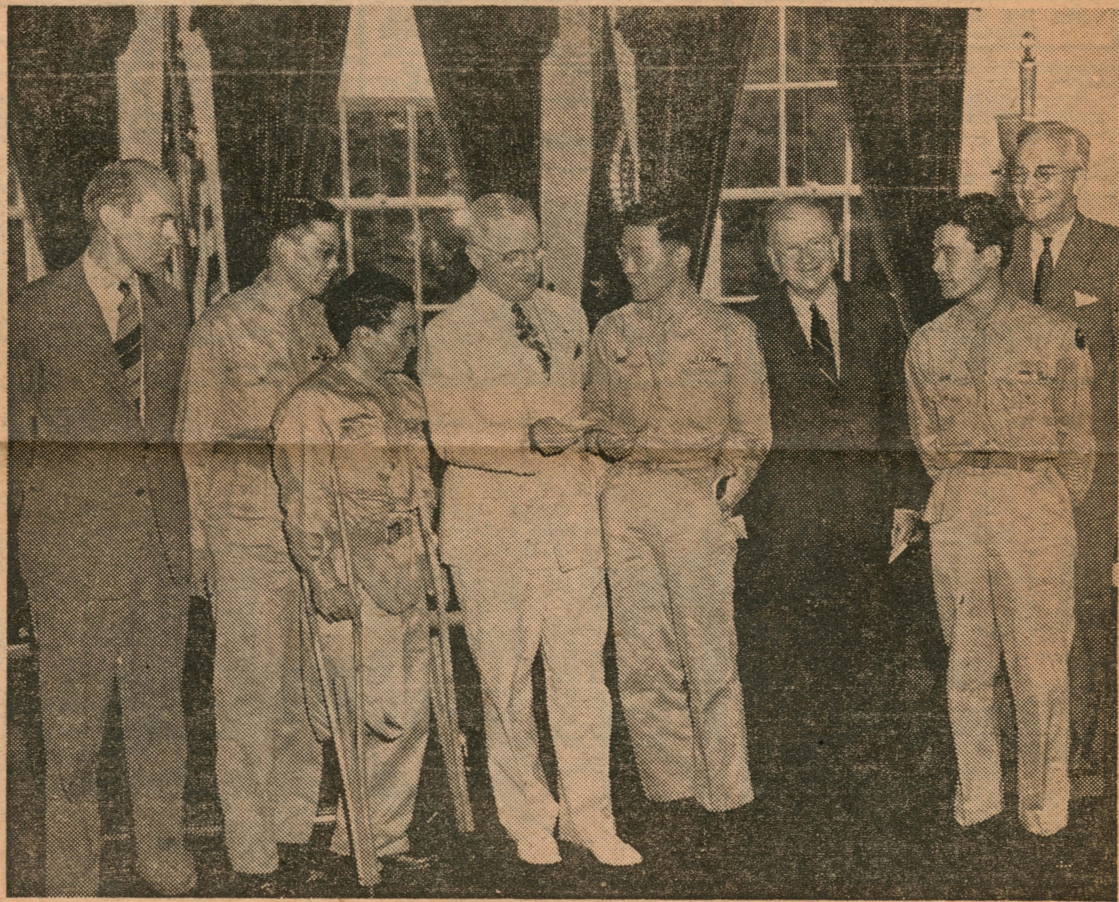
I just came back from Pisa. I bought
