"The Great John L." is playing tonight. I don't know when we're going back to our company but I don't want to go back until I get my P.X.

I'll finish this letter tomorrow morning.

8:00 AM

They didn't have a movie last night because the motor wouldn't start.

We'll have one tonight, though.

I'm going over to my company this afternoon and pick up my mail.

I don't know when I'm going back
to my company but, it'll probably be
the end of this week.

I'm sending another request. I
hope I'm not rushing you. Just send me
whatever you want to.
