I went into Leghorn this morning so I dropped at the P.X. and bought a sleeping bag. I paid \$14.20 for it. It's getting cold so I thought I may as well get me a bag. I'll send it home when I go home. It's a very nice one, and it's wholesale for us.

I received a letter from you today. You said your'e getting my letters regularly so I'm glad.

Say, Mom, how's about sending me some "nori" and such stuff. We get rice for dinner all the time so things like that come in handy. I'll write the request below.

I REQUEST YOU TO SEND ME SOME CANNED GOODS.

Maybe you can find some things down Chinatown. I hope you can find something.

I'll finish this letter this afternoon. Maybe I'll get some more letters.

4:35 P.M.

I just received three of your letters. I'm glad you can see Kuri-san all the time. It's nice to have friends close by. Say hello to her for me. I went down to pick up the films for tonight's show. We're going to see "Blood on the Sun". It stars James Cagney. I hear it's pretty good.

I hear the chow whistle blowing so I'll end my letter here.
