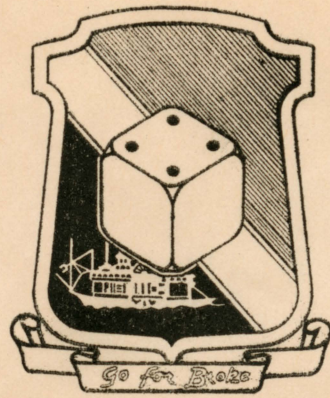
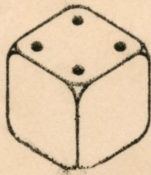
Dear Mom and Pop,

I'm putting CQ (charge of quarters) tonight. That's another name for extra duty. Only sergeants and up pull CQ but I work in the office so I pull it. I don't pull guard or ^{leave to} wake up for roll call and inspection. When you're CQ you stay in the office all night just in case somebody calls up or if there is any trouble. I bring my bed over and sleep here.

Mom, in the next letter send me the address of our friends so I can send them Christmas cards. Many are moving and I don't know their new address.

I wasn't too surprised to hear that Paul married a Caucasian girl. Nothing he does surprises me. I know him too well. Do you have his address? Try and get it for me.

I'm glad to hear you saw Mrs Takagi. I remember them very well. They're both very nice people.



You do you like our stationary. The dice I guess you know shows 4-4-2. The shield is our regimental emblem. It's red white and blue. It doesn't have a die on it though. The fort on the side is a river fort which means the 442 started at Mississippi. We wear this pin on our caps and hat. "Go for Broke" is our motto and it means "shoot the works."
