We got mattresses today. Boy, that cot will be nice and soft now. I have a sleeping bag & blankets so it'll be nice and warm too.

Will you do me a favor? Weigh my trumpet and case and see if it's 11 pounds or over. If it isn't, have it insured and send it to me. I turned my coronet in last week because they turned all the instruments of 206 Band in. The boys went home (most of them) so no more fund.



Of course, I don't need it but I'd like to have something to blow on at nights. All the boys ask me what happened to the noise and rocket they use to hear at nights. It's not too important. Just find out if it weighs too much or not. I'll write the request below.
