Dear Mom and Pop,

Not much doing today. I hope it stays this way. The weather isn't very good today. I think it's going to rain.

I sent the package to you this morning. It might take time, but you'll get it eventually. I had two letters from you yesterday. I'd like to see the pen and pencil set you bought for me, but I guess I can wait until I get home.

My legs feel stiff this morning from that horse back riding we had yesterday. If I go regularly I'll get use to it. We're planning to go again next Sunday.

The mail hasn't come in yet, so I don't know if I have any mail today or not. I haven't received any packages for a long time. I guess it's the Christmas rush that delays the stuff.

I'm going this afternoon to pick up the movie for tonight. I usually take my time and loaf around the town for an hour or two.

Well, how's everything in San Francisco? See anyone you knew and didn't see for a long time? I sure would like to see the old city again. It'll be pretty soon so I can wait. I hope.

I'm sending another request.

I REQUEST YOU TO SEND ME SOME MAGAZINES AND CANNED GOODS.
