I received two letters from you yesterday.

I'm going to Leyburn and pick up the ash tray this afternoon so I'll mail the watches and things together. Don't worry. I have it packed in paper, then in a box and then wrapped in cardboard. Then I have a wooden box filled with saw dust so that should do the trick.

I might go up to Florence just to loaf around. I don't yet. I might not have time.

I'm writing a request again for some magazines.

The regiment is going to get more replacements pretty soon. I hear that they are in Italy already.

Me with my 29 points, I hope I can get some on it. The boys that come over after me have anywhere from 7 to 18 points.

John had a letter from J. Matsushima about a week ago and he wrote that he was in Tokyo. Boy, we really are scattered from our basic training camp.

There isn't much doing today. The same  
old stuff. Did you go see the Gatch's in  
Berkeley yet?

When Bot comes around to San Francisco  
say hello to him for me. Tell him his company  
and Land I are acting as riot companies in  
case we should have trouble with the Italians.

Well, enough for today. I'll write again  
soon
