Not much doing today. The weather is very nice today but a little windy. I hope I receive some packages from you today. The mail is very slow these days because of the bad flying weather and the ships aren't coming over like they used to during the war.

The picture we had last night was very good. The picture was good and the film was new so I didn't have much trouble with it. When the film is old, the track on the film always jumps so it makes it hard for the man that runs it. I don't want to brag, but I'm getting pretty good at running the projector. You think I should start a theater when I get home?

I don't have much to write about yet, so I'll write this letter this afternoon.

1:00 PM

Well, here is another afternoon. The wind is really blowing today. No letters came in since I got back from Cortina. I hope it comes in soon. You seem to be getting my letters pretty regularly.

I'm going to the movies again in Leghorn tonight. This is about all there is to do at nights. The picture in town tonight is "San ANTONIO" with Errol Flynn. I think it's a pretty good show. The movies we get out here is mostly new so we get to see all recent shows. I'm going to feel funny when I get home and have to pay when I go into a theater.
