I received a couple of letters from you today.

I'm glad to hear that Bot is getting along ok. You might be interested to know that before he was started Dr. Higaki had a young man doing the same thing Bot is doing and when the war started he got in the Army and was commissioned as a second lieutenant.

Our pay was late this month because the value of lire just went down. We get 225 lire to one American dollar. Before it was 100 for one dollar. So we get more money but the prices of things will go up so it won't make much difference. We're getting paid today. Instead of getting \$82, I'll get around \$184.50 in lire of course. \$184.50 in lire is the same in American money of \$82.

I have some pictures we took up there. I still have a couple more I send.

We had a lot of pictures taken up there.  
Well, how's every thing going on back home?  
Are things still hard to get yet? I hope  
Jo-Ann can get a car by the time I'm home,  
but these cars are hard to get.

I'm sending a request again. I'd like  
to have some socks again.

Well, it looks like old man winter is  
finally going away. It's getting warmer as  
the days go on. At least I know I  
won't have to stay out here winter here.

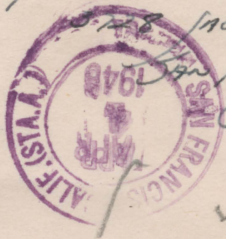
