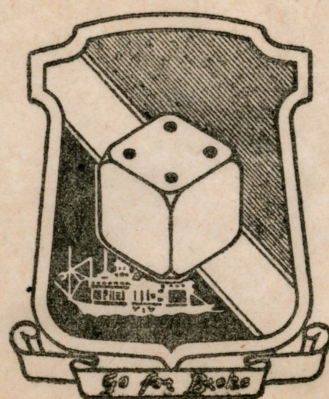
Dear Mom and Pop,

I REQUEST YOU TO SEND ME SOME MAGAZINES AND CANDY.

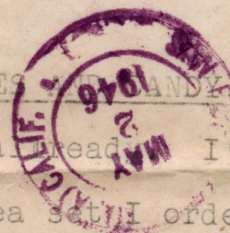
I hope you sent the cigarettes I asked for already. I'm going down to Florence next week to pick up the tea set I ordered.
