

March 20, 1946

Dear Glen and Pop,

I received a letter you wrote on March
18. I received another written on the
17th of March.

You said that, if you sent me the
twenty cartons ^{of cigarettes}, I may not get them in time
because it takes about 2 months to get here.
When I wrote you I had things all
planned out. Now, when I ask for some-
thing, don't think I don't plan a head.
I had it figured to 2 weeks you'd get the
dinner set. The next time I ask
for something please send it, will you!

I don't know what you hear about
us fresh from but don't listen to too
much idle gossip.

The boys that came over just before me
saw a lot of combat where as, we missed
most of it. There's a lot of boys that came
over after me but has been in the Army
longer so they do have more points than
I have.

I'll be frank. I never told you a point
when I was coming home because I
didn't want to make you too anxious.
I have 34 points which is the same as
having nothing. There's still guys over
here with 10 points. I'll have two
years of service in August. This means
I won't be back until at least
July or August. More likely I'll don't
go home around July.

I'm getting tired of friends writing
me saying they'll be seeing me next
month or so. Let's settle once and
for all. I'll be here a few months
yet so don't get any false hopes about
me being home on April or May.
