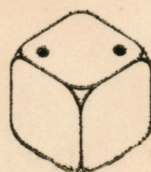
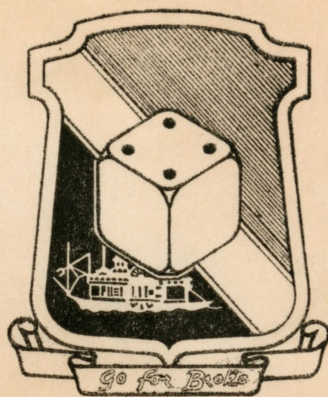
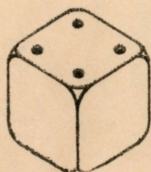

I hope in yesterday's letter I didn't hurt your feelings any, but I hope you remember what I said. As for the cigarettes it's too bad now as you better forget about it.

Since I stick around Public Relations Office a great deal of my time, (I may come back this morning) I hear and know quite a bit of things that I really shouldn't know about.

I found out that the regiment may deactivate around June or July. We may go up to Austria or we may go home;



one way or the other, it won't make much difference to me because I'll go home around July.

Today was the first time I didn't get a letter from you. Lately, I get at least a letter a day.

By the way, what I told you about the regiment must not be told to anyone. I mean that! I shouldn't be telling you just I thought you might like to know. After it comes out in the paper, then it's OK. Don't tell anybody no matter what contrary things they tell you.
