Dear Mom and Pop,

I thought I'd write another letter today. Not much doing now.

I'm just loafing around in the tent.

We had a nice Easter Service at our company this morning.

The weather is very good today. It's more like spring than summer. It was kind of cold and cloudy this morning but it cleared up this afternoon.

The camp seems kind of quiet today. I guess most of the boys are taking a afternoon nap.

I'm going to take a day off tomorrow.  
I think I've been working too hard  
lately. I'll go to Leghorn and look  
around tomorrow afternoon.

I'd like to go down to Rome for a  
week one of these days but I don't  
know if I can or not. It's pretty hard  
for me to leave for a week. A couple of  
days is OK but one week will give too  
much work for me. Well, I'll ask the  
captain one of these days anyway.

The other day Perry got a letter  
from Mike Masaka and told him that  
the Regiment may go home around  
June to be deactivated. How true

it is, I don't know but let's hope  
for the best. Anyway, I won't be  
in the army any longer than August.  
Well, this is about all I guess.  
I'll send a request with this letter.
