I just finished eating my lunch. We had hamburgers.

I received tow packages from you today. They both had a carton of cigarettes adn lots of magazines and candy. Thanks very much. I found the article about the Nesei, too. I gave it to Terry and he put it in the Regimental Scrapbook. This book will go to the War Department files as soon as the regiment breaks up.

Well, I think that Ryo's and my orders will come pretty soon. We're going to Graves Registration Unit, you know. Ryo and I will form a searching party and go all over Italy. I found out that we'll get Army pay plus GRU pay. Aside from that we'll get \$5 a day for the time we spend out in the field. It sounds pretty good. We're planning to work around the Appennines because I know the country side around there pretty thouroughly.

The thousand odd guys that are going to be left behind when the regiment goes home will be transferred to various units and some might even go up to the 88th Division. This is way over near Venice. I'm glad that I know I'm not going over there.

We're kept busy these days because we're handing in all the supplies. I'm taking inventory this afternoon and tomorrow morning I'll turn in all the special service items and the I & E Material. Terry and Ryo are busy finishing up the scrapbook and the paper. WE're all pretty busy.

Well, how's things back home. I hope you're all getting along OK. The way I hear things it's still pretty hard to buy and go places back home. This should clear up by the time I get back home.

The weather is getting hotter by the day. Today seems like a real summer day! How is the weather in San Francisco?

I have some pictures that Ryo took so I'll send them to you. The dog is Tiny.

Well, this is about all for today so I'll write more tomorrow,
