The weather now days are really hot. All we do around here is sit and drink cokes.

I'm the medic for this unit so
once in a while when someone
gets hurt or sick, I take care
of them.

I'm going to send a request again.
I REQUEST you to SEND ME SOME
MAGAZINES and CANDY.

I guess I didn't tell you for the
last time I came back from the
trip to Fort de la Marmite. I brought
back eight fodies. They're all
bones. The lieutenant was pretty pleased
because before me, he sent two teams
up there to look for fodies and they
didn't come back with any. These
"habujins" aren't very bright. They
don't know how to do things.

We have a movie here every night
so life isn't too dull. We don't
get newspapers out here so I
don't know what's happening.

I haven't seen a paper for
about two weeks now.

Bye and I met a Italian family
out here in town. They're very nice
people. We had dinner with them
the other night. The father is a
wood worker. He makes cabinets and
things like that. He makes some beautiful
things. I wish I could bring
some back.

today so more tomorrow.
