Dear Mrs. Ishida

Thanks for your letter of March 2, I received it yesterday with about 35 other letters. Some of them from Mrs. Belieu: or not - it happened again - Ted and yours came together.

In a way this is a big family reunion - everybody is here. I'm on one end and Ted is on the other. They just happened to put the Band at other end. We are about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile apart.

Since U-E^{day} has been declared - we are taking it easy. At present I'm searching prisoners for arms and other thing that they are not permitted to have.

On the average they have
more money than U.S. soldiers.
Believe it - not. They (most of
them) carry women's silk under-
garments, children's clothes and
other rare civilian clothes.

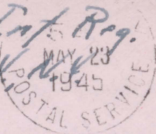
I imagine they had hope of
