We had a very easy day today. We had classes in the morning and in the afternoon we cleaned our rifles and then just loafed.

I'm putting some stamps in the letter. I got it from some friends.

We might go on a overnight hike tomorrow so I might not be able to write to you tomorrow night. We'll have Wednesday afternoon off because we'll come back early Wed morning.

I saw Henry Fukui the other day. I didn't have a chance to talk to me because we were marching by, but he saw me and he knows where I live.

Our company is trying to make arrangements to go to Silver Springs.

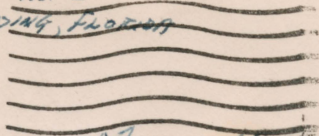
