Dear Mom and Pop,

Today is Sunday so I slept rather later than usual. I woke or got up out of bed around 9:30 AM and then did my laundry. We send our dirty clothes out once a week but it takes one week to come back so we wash our small items ourselves. The laundry bill is \$1.50 a month - government price.

We just ate our lunch. We had chicken today. Southern fried chicken - it was very good. We also had ice cream.

We're going swimming in the afternoon so I'll finish writing this letter tonight.

We went swimming in the afternoon and came back just in time for dinner. It's raining hard now. We have a drizzle almost everyday so it keeps the place nice and cool.

There isn't much to talk about today so I'll say so-long till the next time.
