Dear Mom and Pop,

I just came back from the main PX and when I got back, I found a package from you for me on my bed. Thank's very much for the candy. If the candy is in a small bag like that, it's just right because I want to carry it in my pocket.

We really had a easy day today. In the morning we had bayonet practice, then we saw a movie on "England." It's sort of a newsreel. It was very interesting. In the afternoon we had a medical examination. We get one every 30 days and every 90 day we get a complete medical exam. Nope, I didn't get rejected. I passed - shucks. After that, guess what! We had our pictures taken; - the whole company and our platoon. I'll send you some as soon as it's made. All the time to take photos. I lost my medal last night, so I didn't have a medal to take a picture with. Now I'll have to buy one of my own.

If we lose a medal we can buy one as long as you have an officers permission so it's okay.

We finished taking the pictures around 2:00 PM and then we were free. We didn't have anything to do so we went down to the main PX and got something to read and looked around. There's a lot of Wacs there you know.

I received a letter from Ted today and he said that he's getting along fine in Snelling. He says it's better there than it is at Blanding.

I didn't get a letter from you today so I'll probably get two tomorrow.

We're going to the movies tonight. "Laura" with Gene Tierney is ^{the} main feature.

If I have time tonight I'll write more. If not, I'll write tomorrow. Until then
