Dear Mom and Pop,

I received your Sunday's letter.  
We fired the 81 mm mortar today with  
high explosives. Boy this one made  
twice as much noise as the 60 mm.

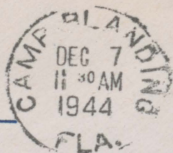
There wasn't too much going today,  
so there isn't too much to write about.

Tomorrow we'll come home around  
9 P.M. We have village fighting. We  
learn how to take one house from  
another that is occupied by the enemy.  
The village is a real village with  
buildings and so forth, but of course  
no one is living there.

The light's out whistle just  
blew so I'll have to end  
this letter. I'll write more  
tomorrow

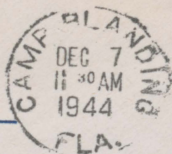
