It is estimated that 50,000,000 Americans smoke tobacco.

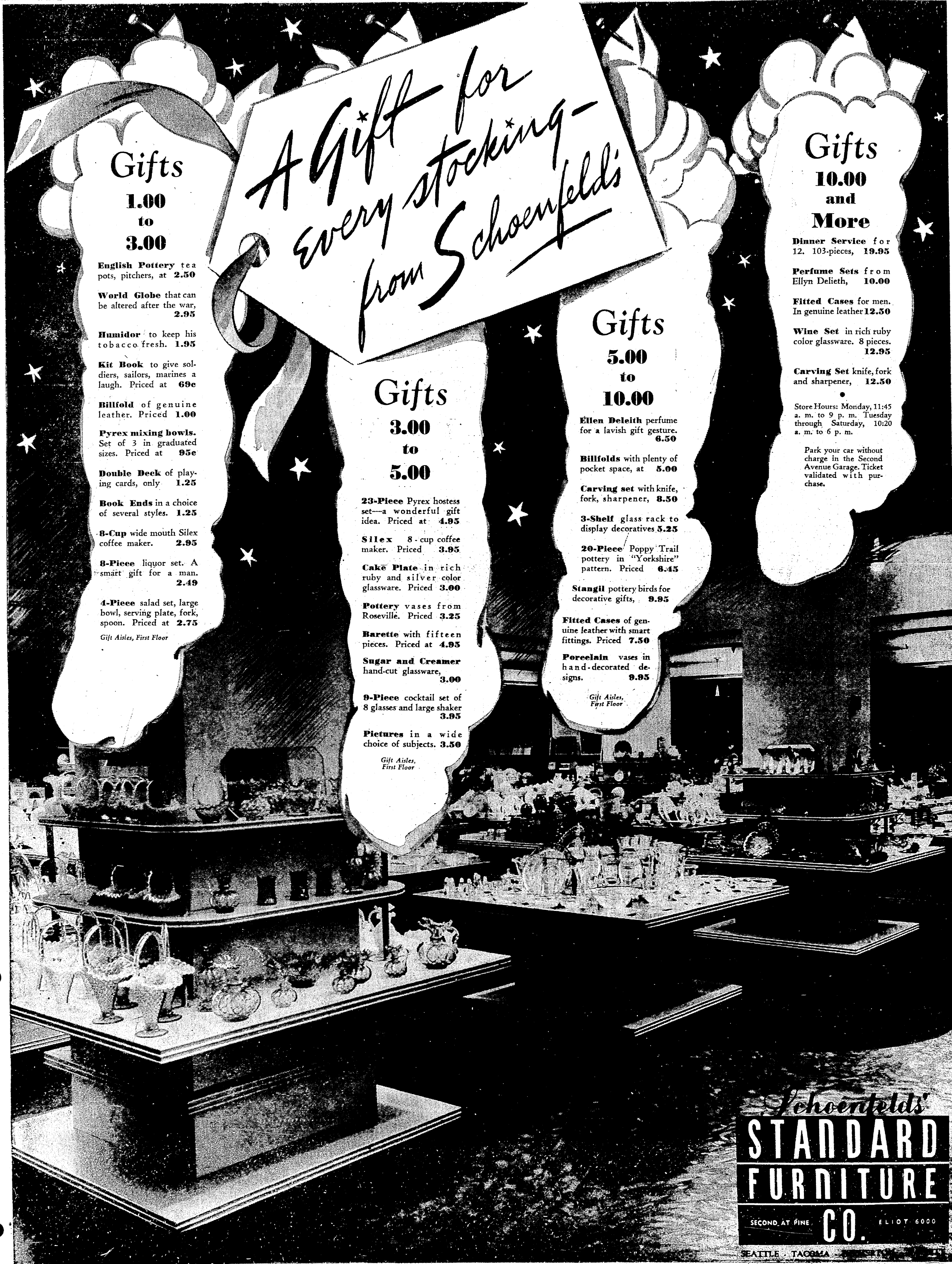
**Press Club to Hear Navy Yard Officer**
