Jap Signaling To 'Subs' Off U.S. Told by De Witt

WASHINGTON, Jan. 20.-(A)-Japanese attacks on the West Coast during the early stages of the war were aided by signaling from the shore, says Lieut. Gen. John L. De Witt, who as commanding general of the Western Shore Defense Command supervised the removal of the Japanese

from that area in 1942.

In his final report on the transmigration, De Witt adds that it brought virtual elimination of the signals and a reduction in the number of submarine attacks on ships sailing from West Coast ports.

Legal Difficulties Encountered The 600-page report, which was issued yesterday, noted difficulties of authority in connection with the

signals. Signaling was observed from buildings that could not be entered without a search warrant and radio messages were intercepted and their source determined within an area of a city block but the Justice Department, the report said, was unwilling to make "mass raids

and at the time, the Army still lacked authority.
