

ALLIES CONTINUE BURMA ADVANCE

NEW DELHI, Jan. 20.—(AP)—Allied forces holding new advance positions on the Arakan sector of Western Burma have fought off Japanese counterattacks again, a Southeast Asia Command communique said today.

In Northern Burma, Lieut. Gen. Joseph W. Stilwell's American-trained Chinese troops continued their eastward advance along the route of the new Ledo highway by capturing the enemy-held village of Gungma, in the Hukwang Valley, and pushing on across the Tanai River.

CHUNGKING, Jan. 20.—(AP)—Mitchell bombers of the Fourteenth United States Air Force attacked targets in French Indochina Tuesday and yesterday, hitting at the dock and railway areas of the Port of Campha and bombing and strafing Japanese barracks at Mon Kay.

Lieut. Gen. Joseph W. Stilwell's communique said heavy black smoke spiraling from one of the buildings struck at Campha indicated oil stores had been hit.

Smoke was visible for ten miles as the result of the Mon Kay attack. All aircraft returned safely.

Radio Tokyo, in a broadcast reported to the office of War Information, said Japanese planes shot down five Allied transport planes, loaded with troops and materials for Chungking, and two fighter planes yesterday on the India-China air route.

NEW YORK, Jan. 20.—(AP)—The Chungking radio said in a dispatch recorded by United States government monitors last night that two Japanese warships "hit exploding mines and sank off Hsiakiangow near Tunglu" on the Yangtze River January 4 "The enemy suffered considerable losses," the broadcast said.

Tunglu is about 200 miles from the mouth of the Yangtze.

Contact With Nazi Preceded Bolivia Revolt

By Associated Press. MONTEVIDEO, Uruguay, Jan. 20.—A secret conference at Buenos Aires in the home of Count Karl von Luxburg, former German minister to Argentina, was said here today to have preceded the December 20 revolution in Bolivia.

The authority for his report, whose identity must remain secret, said that information on the conference came through at least two diplomatic channels.

Bolivian revolutionary leaders were in contact with Argentine Nationalists at this meeting, these informants said, and Victor Paz Estensborro, finance minister in the new Bolivian regime of President Maj. Gualberto Villarroel, was reported to have received "some millions of Argentine pesos."

The informants said this word was included in information exchanged by 18 American republics in connection with the question whether recognition should be accorded to the Villarroel regime.

So far, Argentina has been the only nation to grant such recognition.

Mother Dies; Man Sings

JERSEY CITY, N. J., Jan. 20.—(AP)—Louis D'Angelo, baritone, sang the role of the physician in Verdi's "La Traviata" last night at the Metropolitan Opera House in New York, unaware that his aged mother, Mrs. Caroline D'Angelo, had died of a heart attack here before he went on stage.

D'Angelo told his daughter, Mrs. Louise Lombardo, that throughout the performance he had a premonition that his 86-year-old mother would not live through the night.

NAZIS FIGHT TO PROTECT FIUME

LONDON, Jan. 20.—(AP)—Marshal Josip Broz (Tito) reported today that heavy fighting was spreading along the Croat coastal area below Fiume, where the Germans have sprung a new drive apparently aimed at preventing Jugoslavia Partisans from developing a threat to the naval base from the south.

Tito's communique, broadcast by the Free Yugoslav radio and recorded by the Associated Press, said the Germans had launched two drives toward the coastal area, one in Croatia and the second in Western Bosnia, and that fighting was mounting in intensity.

Other German forces apparently were attempting to drive through toward the Adriatic from the Western Bosnian town of Mrkonjegrad.

Partisan troops threw attacking Germans back near the Croatian town of Banova Jaruga with heavy losses, Tito's bulletin said, and repulsed all enemy attempts to breach their lines near the town of Oalj, west of Zagreb.

German motorized columns were attacked near Ljubljana, Slovenian city 35 miles from the Italian frontier, Tito reported, and more than 400 German officers and men were killed during the fierce battle that followed.

Further to the south in the Ogulin-Karlovac sector, 40 miles east of Fiume, units of the 370th German Division were defeated with heavy losses, the Yugoslav communique asserted.

Kentuckians Or Japs? Wallace Paper Is in Bad!

FRANKFORT, Ky., Jan. 20.—(AP)—An article subtitled "Kentuckians or Japs?" from an Iowa farm magazine, Wallace's Farmer, formerly edited by Vice President Henry A. Wallace, now listed as "editor on leave," was presented to a joint legislative appropriations committee by a riled group representing vocational agriculture in Kentucky.

J. O. Matlick, editor of The Kentucky Farmers Home Journal, read passages from the article and declared that telegrams of protest were being prepared for dispatch to Wallace, Kentucky senators and representatives in Washington and other officials.

Iowans Asked to Decide The magazine article was published following a survey to determine if Iowa farmers would prefer Japanese-Americans or Kentucky mountaineers to relieve a labor shortage. Some of the typical answers were printed as follows:

"Japs couldn't be satisfied here. Our ways are too different. Kentuckians would blend completely with us in another generation."

"With a little more patience on our side we can teach the Kentuckians about Iowa farming. They may be mighty willing to learn."

"Let's give our American-born Japs a chance. They are more like us."

"If a local committee could pick the Kentucky farmers to do the jobs, they might work out all right."

"I don't trust the Japs, and I don't like Kentuckians. It seems we can manage if we get a little more machinery."

More Schooling Urged However, a tabulation of answers showed 40 per cent of the Iowa farm men would prefer workers from the hill countries of Kentucky to 10 per cent in favor of Japanese-Americans.

Presentation of the article to the appropriations committee was in line with an appeal for more funds to promote vocational education, including vocational agriculture, in Kentucky.

"That's the kind of reputation we're getting because we're not educating our farmers," Matlick declared. "All they need is an opportunity."

Legal Difficulties Encountered The 600-page report, which was issued yesterday, noted difficulties of authority in connection with the signals.

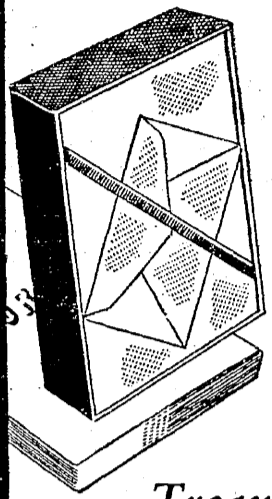
For several weeks after the attack on Pearl Harbor, the general's report said, every ship leaving West Coast ports was attacked by enemy submarines.

Three Attacks Cited The submarines, De Witt said, also apparently were apprised of the range of coastal-defense guns and on one occasion an enemy vessel surfaced and shelled the coast from the only position in which it would not be in range. The report cited three specific instances of attacks by enemy submarines or airplanes, each upon unprotected spots.

The department noted that invariably, Japanese communities on the West Coast flanked strategic installations while there were no Japanese in nearby, available farming sections.
