## COSTLY THIRST PARLORS UNLICENSED IN TACOMA

Many Blind Pigs Spring Up as Result of Differences Between Mayor and Council.

TACOMA, Friday, Sept. 13.—There are now fourteen saloons in this city running without a license, and prosecuting Attorney Rowland is threatening to close them all. Unless something is done soon Tacoma will have more costly thirst parlors in the "blind pig" class than any other three cities in the North-

west. The cause of the condition is the refusal of Mayor Wright to approve of any more bonds of saloons until John Malone, a prominent Democrat of the city, who for years has been running a saloon here, is given back his license, which was taken from him about two months ago because he kept his resort open on Sunday.

# U. S. NEED NEVER BE AFRAID OF MIKADO

Col. W. A. Glassford, After Completing Study of Strategic Positions Declares Pacific Coast Is Safe.

## RECOMMENDS DEFENSES FOR HAWAIIAN HARBOR

Coming of Fleet to This Side Regarded as Necessary Move in View of Recent Developments in Occident.

SAN FRANCISCO, Friday, Sept. 13.—Lieut.-Col. W. A. Glassford, chief of the signal corps of the Department of California, has just made a close study of the strategic positions of the United States in Alaska and on the Hawaiian Islands and believes that Uncle Sam is fully prepared to cope with the Japanese situation in the event of hostilities. He regards the transfer of the Pearl Harbor fleet to the Pacific Coast as necessary to its protection. He says the improvement of Pearl Harbor in Hawaii should be made at once. He regards it as one of the most important strategic points in the Pacific.

Col. Glassford is not alarmed at the immigration of Japanese to Hawaii. He says in case of war the Japanese would drive the Japanese vessels from the Sandwich Islands and the Japanese would scatter to the interior. The more Japanese there are on the islands the easier the task would be, he said.

Col. Glassford does not believe the Pacific Coast would be at the mercy of Japanese if the latter attempted to land troops. He says the transportation of troops across the Pacific is a difficult task and could not be accomplished unless the sea was swept of enemies. The severest transcontinental lines afford ample accommodation for the transportation of troops. He regards Alaska as a country with a great future.

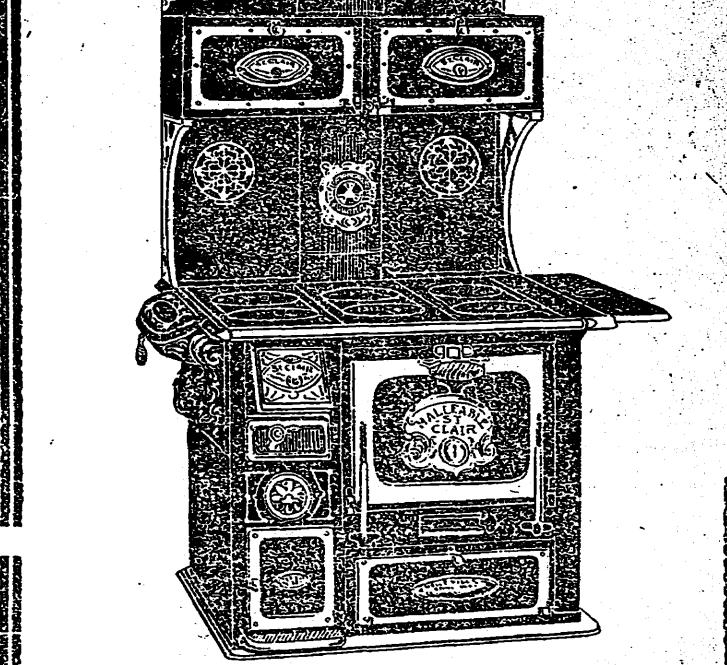
