

TRUCKERS MAY TRADE TIRES

WASHINGTON, Feb. 3.—(AP)—The Office of Price Administration ruled yesterday that essential truck operators in areas where recapping facilities are inadequate or unavailable may exchange with dealers a tire needing recapping for a used tire or one made of reclaimed rubber.

Beginning February 7, operators may obtain from local rationing boards certificates authorizing such exchange.

2-Year Service Men in Pacific To Get Leaves

WASHINGTON, Feb. 3.—(AP)—American veterans of long hitch in the Second World War soon may be coming home on furlough under a "troop-rotation" plan to be inaugurated by the War Department.

Lieut. Gen. Millard F. Harmon, commanding general of Army Forces in the South Pacific, disclosed yesterday that such a program will begin with men who have been in the area two years or longer. But he warned that it would be tempered by combat requirements and transportation facilities, and that it could not be construed as promising a furlough for all men of two years' service in the South Pacific.

"A program of rotation has been initiated . . .," he said, "on a scale considered commensurate with the means available. As those means increase, the program will be expanded."

Harmon made the announcement at a news conference. In Washington for staff conferences, he also disclosed that approximately 60 per cent of the pilots and crews shot down over enemy territory in the South Pacific have been rescued, some with the help of friendly natives, some by Navy PBV patrol-bombers, which have even landed in enemy harbors under fighter cover and picked up airmen under the noses of the Japanese.
