Negro Troops in Jungles Of Burma Have Hero List

STEELE Chicago Daily News Foreign Service AT AN ADVANCE BASE IN NORTHERN BURMA, Feb. 21.—American Negro troops who are heroes, too — men like Roy Lee Smith, operator of one of those flat-bottomed boats that ply the forest-lined rivers of Northern Burma, with cargoes of men, supplies and Chinese wounded.

Two Chinese Saved Traveling along the Tanai River in one of these light craft last Saturday, we had just passed through a mean stretch of the swift current when somebody remarked: "That's where five men died."

Three American Negro boys and two Chinese never came up. Smith, dragging the weight of his uniform and heavy shoes, managed to keep afloat. He grabbed two Chinese as they floated helplessly by and got them ashore.

Smith is from Lexington, Ky. Last week, he was doing duty on the same kind of boat in another part of the river when he had a second brush with eternity.
