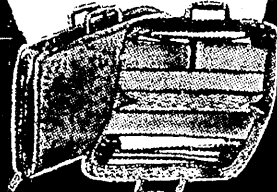

Mayor William F. Devin's request for creation in his office of a position of executive assistant—tantamount to an assistant mayorship—was turned down informally by members of the City Council at a conference this forenoon.

Would Relieve Mayor The executive assistant, if the post were created, would relieve the mayor of part of the increasing administrative load.

Duties May Be Changed The mayor said the Council majority favored leaving the secretary position as it is at present, with revisions in duties of the position to be made, if necessary, in a proposed new City Charter now being drafted.

Silver Star For Lieut. Mermod, Killed in Italy

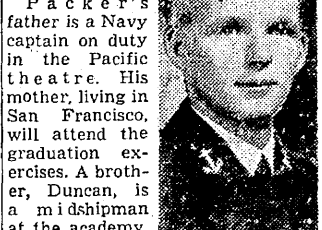

JAPS' CONVICTION HERE REVERSED

The conviction of two Seattle Japanese-American exporters, who were sentenced in 1943 in district court here on charges of conspiracy and of making fraudulent statements to obtain a State Department export license, was reversed yesterday by the United States Circuit Court of Appeals in San Francisco, the Associated Press said.

The men are Charles T. Takahashi, owner-operator of the China Import and Export Company, and Edward Y. Osawa, company manager, who were sentenced by United States District Judge Lloyd L. Black.
