

# Obituaries THOMAS GILLIES TAKEN BY DEATH

Funeral services for Thomas Gillies, Seattle resident since 1886, will be held at 3 o'clock tomorrow at the Johnson & Hamilton mortuary, with burial in Lake View. He died Monday.

Born at Toronto, Ont., 74 years ago, Mr. Gillies came to Seattle when he was 15 years of age and shortly afterward shipped to Scotland on a sailing vessel, returning after a brief period there.

During the fire of 1889, Mr. Gillies was a volunteer fireman and served with the Fire Department several years. He then became associated with the Ayres Transfer & Warehouse Company, serving with them 28 years until his retirement three years ago.

Surviving is a sister, Mrs. Jessie W. Williams of Seattle.

**Seattle Jap Draft Evader Sentenced**  
BOISE, Idaho, Sept. 28.—(AP)—United States District Judge Chase A. Clark today sentenced Thomas Akio Hoshino, 25 years old, Seattle, to pay a \$300 fine and serve three years and three months in a federal penitentiary for failure to report for Selective Service induction.

Hoshino was one of 34 Nisei from the Minidoka Relocation Center at Hunt, Idaho, convicted or pleading guilty to draft violations. One was acquitted.
